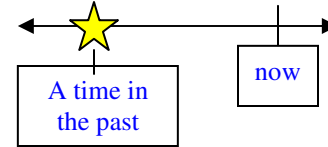


The Past Tense – Simple Past

There are three aspects of the past tense:

- 1) Simple past
- 2) Past progressive
- 3) Past perfect (simple and progressive)

★ = action



The **simple past tense** is used to describe:

1. an action that happened in the past
2. a truth about a time in the past

- Add “**ed**” or “**ied**” to *regular* verb endings in simple past tense when used to describe any subject (**I, you, we, they, he, she, it**).

Subject [verb + “ed” or “ied”]

The verb “**to be**” has an irregular conjugation:

I / he / she / it [was]
you / we / they [were]

Example: He walked to school yesterday.

Example: She was happy.

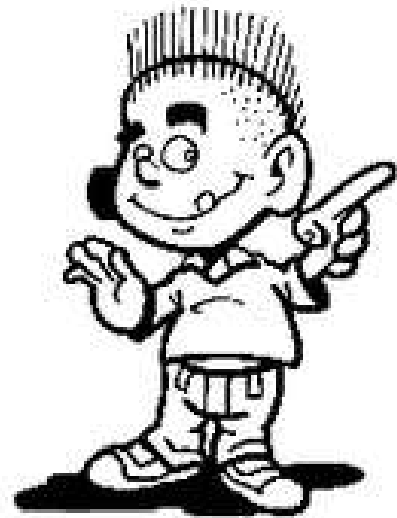

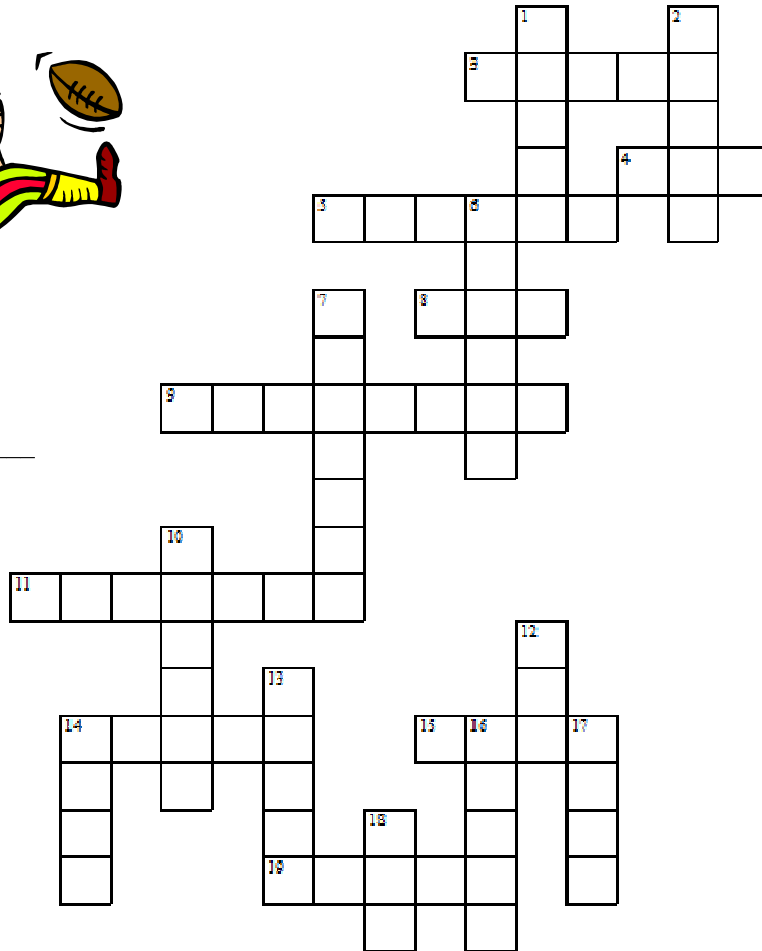

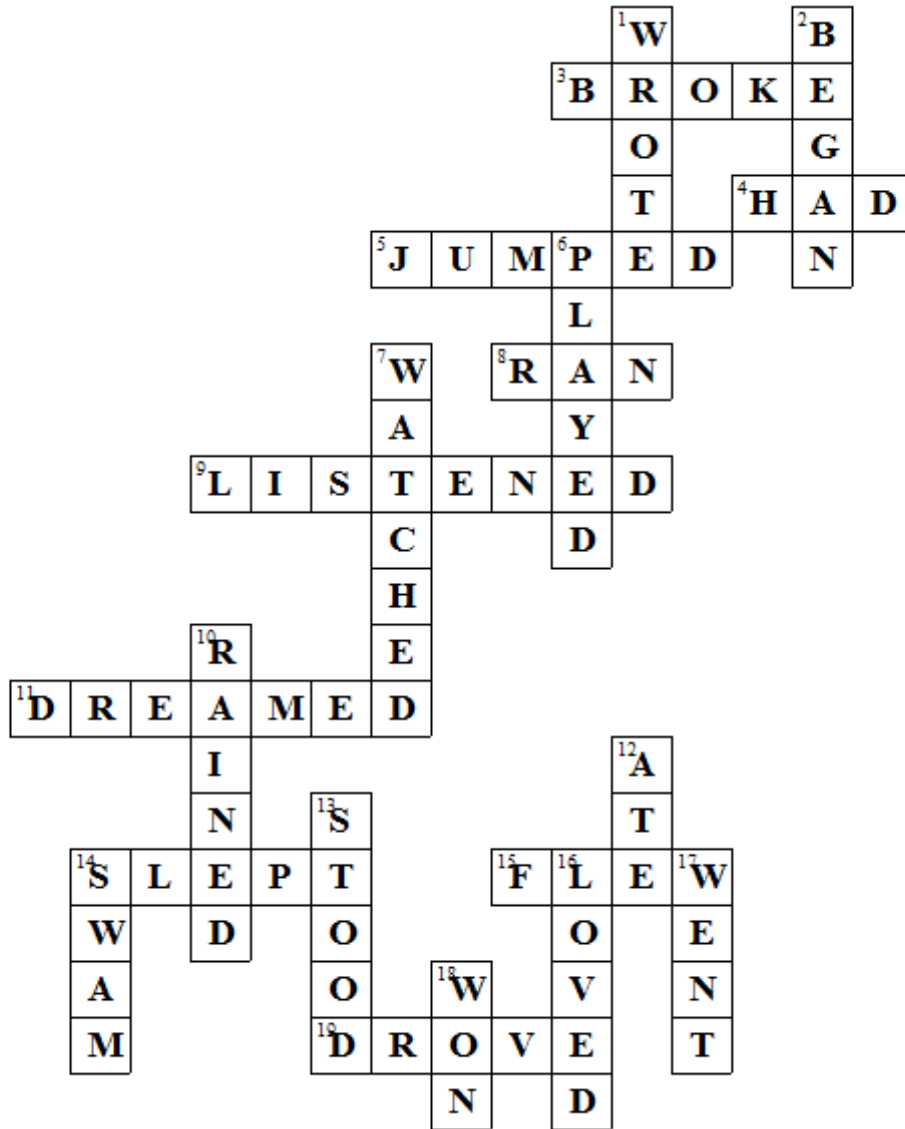
