The **simple past tense** is used to describe:

- 1. an action that happened in the past
- 2. a truth about a time in the past
- Add "ed" or "ied" to regular verb endings in simple past tense when used to describe any subject (I, you, we, they, he, she, it).

Subject	[verb + "ed" or "ied"]

The verb "to be" has an irregular conjugation:




