


COMPOSITION



visual composition

Composing a visual image consists in arranging and placing the elements on the basic plane.

This means arranging the elements of the image and giving them order and unity, which will in turn give the composition concrete meaning and consistent form.


A combination of order and visual unity of an image gives a composition harmony that appeals to us when we look at it.

center of interest

The center of interest in art is the main focus of a drawing, painting or photograph, also known as focal point.



Use objects within your drawing space to point to your focal point. The lines of the two steps on the platform in Figure 1 lead the view's eye to the focal point.

Add depth by using details in the foreground, middle ground, and background in your composition.





dynamic elements of a composition: balance

A composition is well-balanced when the form, texture, colour, direction and placement of its elements are arranged in a way that no changes could make it more pleasing to the eye. It is well-balanced when there is equal "weight" on each side.



dynamic elements of a composition: visual weight

Visual weight is a measure of the force that an element exerts to attract the eye.

Some factors that affect the visual weight of an element:

size, shape, form/space, isolation, density, colour, value, intrinsic interest, texture, volume, depth, perceived visual weight, location/position, orientation






visual weight: colour









dynamic elements of a composition: **movement**

Movement adds excitement to a composition.

Artwork may incorporate actual motion; that is, the artwork itself moves in some way.

Or it may incorporate the illusion of, or implied, movement.



An element that occurs in a composition over and over again.


The element can repeat in a consistent pattern.

Or it can repeat in a variation of the pattern.


dynamic elements of a composition: symmetry



dynamic elements of a composition: proportion

Proportion refers to the relative size of parts of a whole (elements within an object).







dynamic elements of a composition: simplify

Simplification is the technique of reducing a composition to only the most essential elements that support the visual statement.








Law of Proximity:

Objects near each other tend to be grouped together.

The circles on the left appear to be grouped in vertical columns, while those on the right appear to be grouped in horizontal rows. Elements that are placed close to each other will often be perceived as one group.






Law of Similarity:

Items that are similar tend to be grouped together.


In the image above, most people see vertical columns of circles and squares.



Law of Continuity:

Lines are seen as following the smoothest path.


In the image above, the top branch is seen as continuing the first segment of the line. This allows us to see things as flowing smoothly without breaking lines up into multiple parts.





golden ratio
