2. Copy and complete exercises 2 and 3.
3. Read and copy the text on page 94. Underline the highlighted words.
4. Copy and complete exercises 2, 3, and 4.

Writing:

1. Write **one sentence** for each of these modal verbs from unit 7:
May, might, can, could, should, must / mustn't.
2. Write **one sentence** for each of these 3 modal verbs, conjugating them correctly:
have to, need to, be able to
3. Select relevant vocabulary for Coronavirus and write 5 sentences about health.
