

# 3<sup>o</sup> Person Rules

1. Most verbs in English form the third-person singular by adding -s to the base form (sings, gives, requires).
2. Verbs ending in -ch, -s, -sh, -x, or -z form the third-person singular by adding -es (watches, misses, rushes, mixes, buzzes).
3. Verbs ending in a consonant + y (such as try) form the third-person singular by changing the y to i and adding -es (tries).

As their name suggests, certain irregular verbs have special forms. The third-person singular of be in the present tense is is, the third-person singular of have is has, the third-person singular of do is does, and the third-person singular of go is goes.

# 3º Person Rules

1. La mayoría de los verbos en inglés forman el singular en tercera persona agregando -s a la forma base (sings, gives, requieres).
2. Los verbos que terminan en -ch, -s, -sh, -x o -z forman el singular de la tercera persona agregando -es (watches, misses, rushes, mixes, buzzes).
3. Los verbos que terminan en consonante + y (como try) forman la tercera persona del singular cambiando la y a i y agregando -es (tries).

Como su nombre lo indica, ciertos verbos irregulares tienen formas especiales. La tercera persona del singular de -be en tiempo presente es -is, la tercera persona del singular de -have es -has, la tercera persona del singular de -do es -does, y la tercera persona del singular de -go es -goes.
