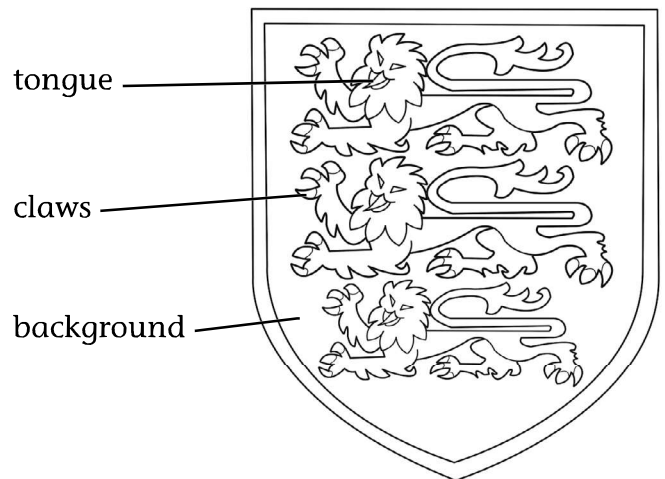


# 1 Life in Medieval Times: Coats of arms

## 1 Read and colour.

This is the coat of arms of some of the medieval English kings. Coats of arms give information about a person. Lions represent a strong, brave person. These lions are gold with blue tongues and claws. This coat of arms has got a red background. The colour red is for a military person or family.

This is a podcar. It is <sup>1</sup>smaller than a car, but four people can travel in it. It is <sup>2</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ than other transport because it uses solar power. It is connected to the <sup>3</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ and it has got a touch screen. You can use your <sup>4</sup>\_\_\_\_\_ or laptop in a podcar.
