
You usually read Roman numerals by adding the symbols together.

| 5 + 1 = 6 | 1000 + 1000 + 500<br>+ 100 = 2600 |    |       |  |


But be careful! Sometimes if there in a smaller number in front of a big number, then you subtract the small number from the big number.




## **Understanding Portraits:** Make a self-portrait.


### 1 Read and answer.

- What his favourite animal? \_\_\_\_\_




