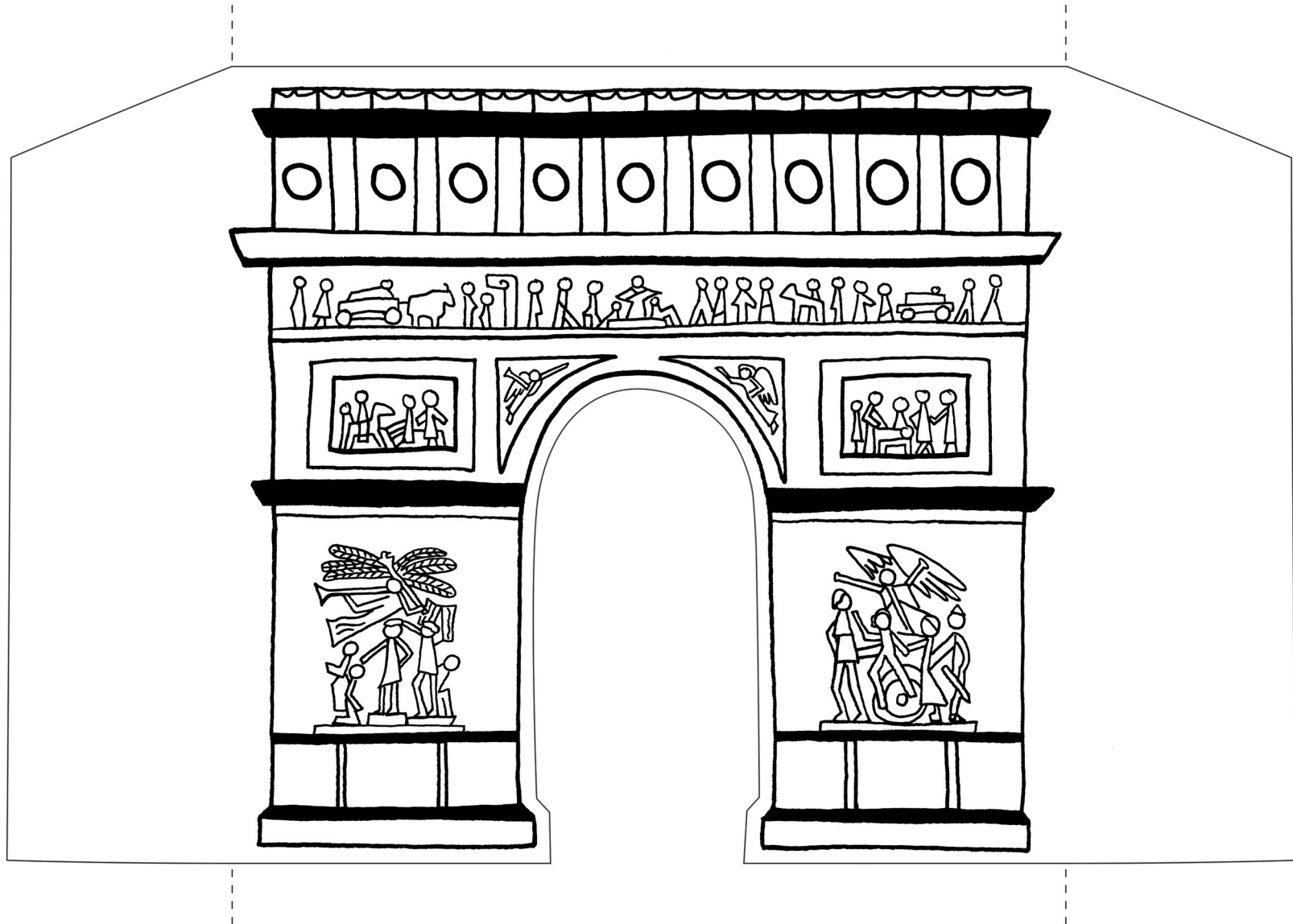



The Arc de Triomphe

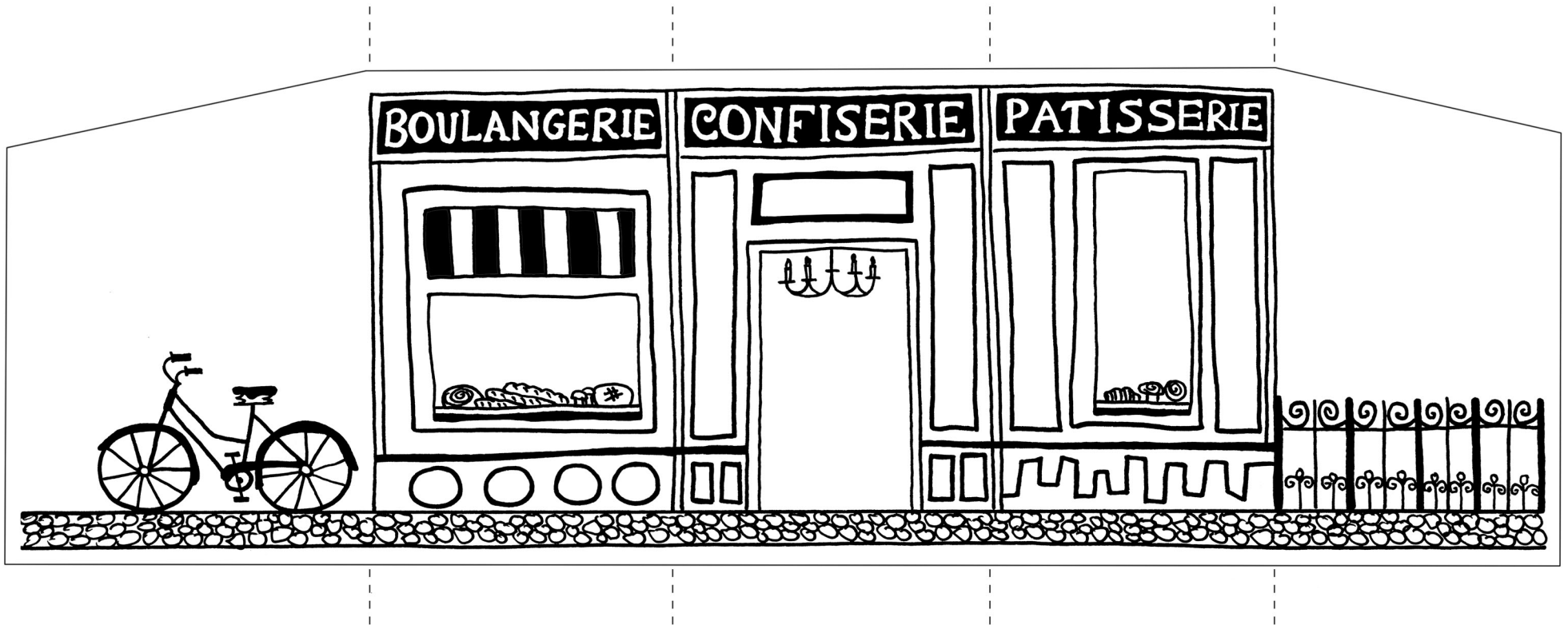
The Arc de Triomphe (Arc de Triomphe de l'Étoile) is one of the most famous monuments in Paris. It honors those who fought for France in the French Revolutionary and the Napoleonic Wars.

The monument was designed by Jean Chalgrin in 1806, and stands 50 meters tall. There is a walkway that goes underground from one side to the other, and you can even climb the 234 steps inside and go to the top..



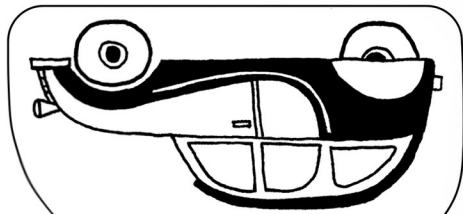

Eiffel Tower
