Expect Respect

With the apparent emphasis on sexual equality in today's society, you could be forgiven for thinking that few teenagers would ever attempt to justify dating violence. Well, unfortunately, you'd be wrong. According to a recent study, 50 % of boys and 33 % of girls think that there are some circumstances where hitting a woman is acceptable. What's more, a shocking 36 % of boys admit that they personally might hit a woman.

In response to these figures, the teen magazine Bliss, together with the charity Women's Aid, created an awareness campaign, which urged teenagers to both give an expect respect in all their relationships. The main aim of the campaign was to challenge young people's assumptions about the roles of males and females and help them to reject all types of dating violence. This focused not only on physical violence, but also the type of verbal abuse that can cause serious damage over time. This verbal abuse can often take the form of threats which can lead a woman to be scared of what might happen in the future.

The campaign also helped young women to perceive the early signs of dating violence and to seek help before the problem escalated. Young women have trouble recognizing that their partner is violent because they tend to associate dating violence with older less confident women. However, if they call the helpline, a counsellor can help them identify potential risks in their partner's conduct.

Cases of celebrities who have suffered dating violence also show that this can happen to anyone. Indeed, such cases may have made society more aware of the fact that dating violence affects younger people as well as older people. However, given that around two British women are killed by their partners or ex-partners every week, we can clearly require more campaigns like Expect Respect.
