

Final Solution	<p>was a Nazi plan for the extermination of the Jews during World War II. This policy of deliberate and systematic genocide across German-occupied Europe was formulated in procedural terms by Nazi leadership in January 1942 at the Wannsee Conference near Berlin, and culminated in the Holocaust which saw the killing of 90 percent of Polish Jewry and two-thirds of the Jewish population of Europe.</p>
Lebensraum	<p>also known as "living space" refers to conceptions and policies of a form of settler colonialism connected with agrarianism that existed in Germany from the 1890s to the 1940s. The most extreme form of this policy was by the Nazi Party and Nazi German</p>
Partisans	<p>member of a guerrilla force led by the Communist Party of Yugoslavia during World War II against the Axis powers</p>
Puppet government	<p>a government which direction and control are exercised by another power</p>
Ribbentrop-Molotov Pact	<p>was a neutrality pact between Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union signed in Moscow on 23 August 1939 by foreign ministers Joachim von Ribbentrop and Vyacheslav Molotov, respectively.</p> <p>The pact delineated the spheres of interest between the two powers, confirmed by the supplementary protocol of the German-Soviet Frontier Treaty amended after the joint invasion of Poland</p>

Scorched-earth policy	A scorched-earth policy is a military strategy that targets anything that might be useful to the enemy while advancing through or withdrawing from an area. Specifically, all of the assets that are used or can be used by the enemy are targeted, such as food sources, transportation, communications, industrial resources, and even the people in the area.
