ACTIONS / VERBS 1

Answer - A reaction to a question, letter, telephone call, etc

Arrive - To reach a place, especially at the end of a journey

Ask to put a question to someone, or to request an answer from someone

Be born When a person or animal is born, they come out of their mother's body and start to exist

Be careful-said to someone to tell them to enjoy themselves at an event or during an activity, but to be sensible, too

Be cold-at a low temperature, especially when compared to the temperature of the human body, and not hot or warm

Be hungry-wanting or needing food

Be quiet - A quiet person is one who does not talk much

Be thirsty - needing to drink

Borrow - to get or receive something from someone with the intention of giving it back after a period of time

Breathe - to move air into and out of the lungs

Break - to (cause something to) separate suddenly or violently into two or more pieces, or to (cause something to) stop working by being damaged

Bring - to take or carry someone or something to a place or a person, or in the direction of the person speaking

Brush - an act of cleaning with a brush

Build - to make something by putting bricks or other materials together

Burn - to (cause something to) be hurt, damaged or destroyed by fire or extreme heat

Buy - to get something by paying money for it

Can - to be able to

Carry - to transport or take something from one place to another

Catch - to take hold of something, especially something that is moving through the air

Chase -to hurry after someone or something in order to catch them

Cheat - to behave in a dishonest way in order to get what you want

Choose - to decide what you want from two or more things or possibilities

Clean - to remove dirt from something

Close - to (cause something to) change from being open to not being open

Comb - to tidy your hair using a comb

Come - to move or travel towards the speaker or with the speaker

Come in - to enter a room or building

Cook - When you cook food, you prepare it to be eaten by heating it in a particular way, such as baking or boiling, and when food cooks, it is heated until it is ready to eat

Copy - to produce something so that it is the same as an original piece of work, or to behave, dress, speak, etc. in a way that is intended to be like someone else, for example, because you admire them

Cough - to force air out of your lungs through your throat with a short loud sound

Cry - to produce tears as the result of a strong emotion, such as unhappiness or pain

Dance - to move the body and feet to music

Destroy - to damage something so badly that it does not exist or cannot be used

Die - to stop living or existing, either suddenly or slowly

Dig - to break up and move soil using a tool, a machine or your hands

Divide - to (cause to) separate into parts or groups

Do - to act or take action

Draw - to make a picture of something or someone with a pencil or pen

Dream - to experience events and images in your mind while you are sleeping

Drink - to take liquid into the body through the mouth

Drive - to move or travel on land in a motor vehicle, especially as the person controlling the vehicle's movement

Eat - to put or take food into the mouth, chew (= crush with the teeth) it, and swallow it

Explain- to make something clear or easy to understand by describing or giving information about it **Examine** - to test someone's knowledge or skill in a particular subject

Fail - to not succeed in what you are trying to achieve or are expected to do

Fall - go down onto the ground or towards the ground without intending to or by accident

Fall in love - to be very attracted to someone and begin to love them

Feed - to give food to a person, group or animal

Fight -To use physical force to try to defeat another person or group of people

Fill in - To write the necessary information on a document

Finish - To complete something or come to the end of an activity

Fish - To catch fish from a river, sea, lake, etc., or to try to do this

Fly - When a bird, insect or aircraft flies, it moves through the air

Follow - To move behind someone or something and go where they go

Forget - To be unable to remember a fact, something that happened, or how to do something

Get dressed - To put clothes on yourself or someone else, especially a child

Get married - To begin a legal relationship with someone as their husband or wife

Get up - To wake up and get out of bed, or to tell or help someone to do this

Give - To offer something to someone, or to provide them with it

Go - To travel or move to another place

Go back - To return

Go down - To move down to a lower level or place

Go out - To leave a room or building, especially in order to do something for entertainment

Go up - To move higher, rise or increase

Gossip - To talk about other people's private lives

Happen - (of a situation or an event) To have existence or come into existence

Hate - To dislike someone or something very much

Have - To perform the action mentioned

ACTIONS 2

Have a bath - to wash in a bath or to wash someone in a bath

Have a shower - to wash using a device which releases drops of water through a lot of very small holes and which you stand under to wash your whole body

Hear - to receive or become conscious of a sound using your ears

Help - to make it possible or easier for someone to do something, by doing part of the work yourself or by providing advice, money, support, etc

Hide - to put something or someone in a place where they cannot be seen or found, or to put yourself somewhere where you cannot be seen or found

Hit - to touch someone or something with sudden force

Hope - to want something to happen or to be true, and usually have a good reason to think that it might

Hurry - to move or do things more quickly than normal or to make someone do this

Iron - to make clothes flat and smooth using an iron

Kick - to hit someone or something with the foot, or to move the feet and legs suddenly and violently

Kill - to cause someone or something to die

Kiss - to touch with your lips, especially as a greeting, or to press your mouth onto another person's mouth in a sexual way

Know - to have information in your mind

Land - to (cause to) arrive at a place after moving down through the air

Laugh - to smile while making sounds with your voice that show you think something is funny or you are happy

Learn - to get knowledge or skill in a new subject or activity

Like - to enjoy or approve of something or someone

Look for - to try to find something or someone

Love - to like another adult very much and be romantically and sexually attracted to them, or to have strong feelings of liking a friend or person in your family

Make - to produce something, often using a particular substance or material

Must - used to show that it is necessary or very important that something happens in the present or future

Open - not closed or fastened

Pass - to be successful in an examination, course, etc

Phone - to be using the telephone

Pick up - the act of picking someone or something up, or the place where it happens

Play - When you play, especially as a child, you spend time doing an enjoyable and/or entertaining activity

Pull - to move something towards yourself, sometimes with great physical effort

Push - to use physical pressure or force, especially with your hands, in order to move something into a different position, usually one that is further away from you

Put - to move something or someone into the stated place, position or direction

Rain - If it rains, water falls from the sky in small drops

Ride - to sit on a horse or a bicycle and travel along on it controlling its movements

Run - to move along, faster than walking, by taking quick steps in which each foot is lifted before the next foot touches the ground

Say - to pronounce words or sounds, to express a thought, opinion, or suggestion, or to state a fact or instruction

See - to be conscious of what is around you by using your eyes

Send - to cause something to go from one place to another, especially by post

Shine - to send out or reflect light

Shop - to buy things in shops

Shout - to express strong emotions, such as anger, fear or excitement, or to express strong opinions, in a loud voice

Shut up - to stop talking or making a noise, or to make someone do this

Sing - to make musical sounds with the voice, usually a tune with words

Sit -to (cause someone to) be in a position in which the lower part of the body is resting on a seat or other type of support, with the upper part of the body vertical

Skate - to move, or make a particular movement on a surface, using skates

Ski - to move over snow on skis

Sleep - the resting state in which the body is not active and the mind is unconscious

Smell - the ability to notice or discover that a substance is present by using your nose

Smile - to make a happy or friendly expression in which the corners of your mouth curve up

Smoke - to breathe smoke into the mouth and usually lungs from a cigarette, pipe, etc.

Speak - to say words, to use the voice, or to have a conversation with someone

Stand - to be in a vertical state or to put into a vertical state, especially (of a person or animal) by straightening the legs

Start - to begin doing something

Stay - to not move away from or leave

Stop - to finish doing something that you were doing

Swim - to move through water by moving the body or parts of the body

Take - to move something or someone from one place to another

Take off - If an aircraft, bird or insect takes off, it leaves the ground and begins to fly

Teach - to give someone knowledge or to train someone; to instruct

Tell - to say something to someone, often giving them information or instructions

Think - to believe something or have an opinion or idea

Tidy - having everything ordered and arranged in the right place, or liking to keep things like this

Touch - to put your hand or another part of your body lightly onto and off something or someone

Travel - to make a journey, usually over a long distance

Turn on - to start to show a particular quality

Turn off - to leave sth working

Underline - to draw a line under a word, especially in order to show its importance

Understand - to know the meaning of something that someone says

Wait - to not start until the correct moment . To allow time to go by,

Wake up - to (cause someone to) become awake and conscious after sleeping

Walk - to move along by putting one foot in front of the other, allowing each foot to touch the ground before lifting the next

Want - to wish for a particular thing or plan of action

Wash - to clean something using water

Water - to pour water on to plants or the soil that they are growing in

Watch - to look at something for a period of time, especially something that is changing or moving

Wear - to have clothing, jewellery, etc. on your body
