 She is one of the best known designers in history. She stood out for being one of the most innovative during the First World War as she defended the freedom to love whoever you wanted regardless of sex or social class.

Alice Guy Blaché

- She worked from 1896 to 1922 and was the first female screenwriter and film director in history. She is considered the most prolific director of all time with over 1000 films, of which only 140 were signed in her name.
- During the first ten years of her career she was the only woman director and the only one to make narrative films that would later be called fiction, and she was also a pioneer in special effects. She began filming with the cameras of her boss, Léon Gaumont. She is credited with the cinematic style that inspired Alfred Hitchcock's filmography. Alice was the first person to make money and a living from film.





Marie Curie

Marie Curie was the one who discovered two new radioactive elements much more powerful than uranium, one of these two elements was named after Marie Curie's homeland, Polonium, and the other was named as Radium. Not only the discovery of these elements made Marie Curie famous, but she was the first person to receive two Nobel Prizes in two different scientific fields, one in physics, together with her husband Pierre Curie and Henri Becquerel, and another in chemistry. She helped to create mobile X-ray equipment during World War I. Years later, in 1934, Marie Curie died of aplastic anemia due to her high exposure to radiation, and 61 years later her remains were transferred to Paris Panthéon in honour of her achievements.



At 26, Russian astronaut Valentina Tereshkova became the first woman to fly into outer space as the sole crew member aboard the Vostok 6 spacecraft, which circled the Earth 48 times in three days.
