### Dinosaurs' Descendants - APRIL

- 5 Millions of years ago, small species of theropods, a dinosaur family that also includes the huge T-Rex, evolved into flying creatures. They're the ancestors of all birds, even flightless ones. The largest, at 2.7 metres tall and weighing 150 kg, is the ostrich, native to Africa. With
- 10 the biggest eyes of any land animal, this non-flier can spot predators up to 3.5 km away. Its kick can even kill a lion!
  And the smallest? That's New Zealand's kiwi.
  Though it seems impossible, this chicken-size bird can outrun
- 15 a person! It's also sometimes called an honorary mammal. Find out why in April, when you'll be able to play an immersive computer game to experience life as a flightless bird!

With our amazing narrated VR technology, you'll be guided through some of the world's unique caves. Here are some examples:

- Ride a boat through the magical limestone Waitomo
   caves in New Zealand, which are lit up by thousands of glowworms.
  - Walk in the footsteps of Jim White, the 16-year-old cowboy who in 1898 made the first recorded explorations of Carlsbad Cavern in New Mexico, USA.
- 30 Look up, and you'll see hundreds of thousands of bats!
  - In Chihuahua, Mexico, you can rappel 300 metres below ground into Cave of the Crystals. Discovered in 2000 when a mining company drained water from under a mountain, the cave
- 35 contains crystals as large as 12 metres long and four metres wide.

Learn the science of volcanoes by making 3D computer models of three famous eruptions. In 1883, there was

- 40 an explosive eruption of Krakatoa in Indonesia. Heard 3,500 km away in Australia, it covered an 800,000-squarekm area with ash, and set off tsunamis around the globe. A 37-metre-high wave killed 36,000 people in Java and Sumatra. In 2010, ash from Eyjafjallajökull, a volcano
- under a glacier in Iceland, rose 9 km high and spread far and wide across Europe, stopping air traffic for a week. For the past 30 years, Kilauea, on the Big Island of Hawaii, has been erupting continuously, releasing a
- 50 steady flow of lava that has destroyed entire neighbourhoods.
