SOLUTIONS (21-05-2020) : FIND THE MISTAKE (= ERROR)

1) COMPLETE THE QUESTIONS WITH THE CORRECT FORM OF BE GOING TO AND THE VERBS BETWEEN BRACKETS(PARENTHESES)

1. ARE you GOING TO STUDY (study) history this evening?
2. IS she GOING TO WATCH (watch) TV at 4 o'clock?

THEORY: THE USE OF WILL + INFINITIVE AND BE GOING TO + INFINITIVE

1. WILL

- We use will to make predictions based on what we believe.

Example: I think it will be difficult to run in this hot weather.

2. BE GOING TO

- We use be going to to make predictions based on external evidence.

Example: Look at the sky. It is going to rain soon.

- We use be going to to talk about future plans.

Example: I am going to wash the car next week.
