THEORY: THE PRONUNCIATION OF THE -ED ENDING.

We observe this ending for the past simple and the past participle of the regular verbs

The -s ending may be pronounced in three different manners:

- 1. / d /
- 2. / t /
- 3. / id/

These pronunciations depends on the consonant that precedes the -ed ending. These are the rules of use:
