THEORY: THE PRONUNCIATION OF THE -ED ENDING.

We observe this ending for the past simple and the past participle of the regular verbs

The -s ending may be pronounced in three different manners:

1. / d /
2. / t /
3. / ɪd /

These pronunciations depends on the consonant that precedes the -ed ending.

These are the rules of use :
