

## VERB FORMS 2° BACH KEY

1. (you get up) Are you going to get up today, or (you stay) are you staying in bed? If you (get up) get up, don't go outside. It (be) is very cold.
2. After a long forced march, Caesar (enter) entered the town only to find that the enemy (flee) had fled: he (make) had made the long march in vain.
3. Don't talk to me. I (try) am trying to learn this page by heart.
4. She's alive! She (drown) was drowning but that handsome man (dive) dived/dove and (save) saved her just in time.
5. I (know) have known Miss Huggins for several years. I (read) am reading her latest novel, but I (not finish) haven't finished it yet.
6. By the end of my tour I (give) will have given exactly the same lecture 56 times.
7. - Why (that man stand) is that man standing in the middle of the road?  
- He (try) is trying to get across. He (wait) is waiting for a gap in the traffic.  
- Why (he not use) isn't he using/doesn't he use the subway?
8. - I (just have) have just had my first driving lesson.  
- How (it go) did it go (you enjoy) Did you enjoy it?  
- Well, I (actually not hit) didn't actually hit anything but I (make) made many mistakes.
9. - She (just sell) has just sold two of her own paintings.  
- She's lucky. I (paint) have painted/have been painting for 5 years and I (not sell) haven't sold a single picture yet.
10. He (sit) was sitting on the bank fishing when he (see) saw a man's hat floating down the river. It (seem) seemed strangely familiar.
11. - Where (you go) are you going (to go) for your next holiday? (*arranged to go*)  
- I don't know yet but we (probably go) will probably go to Spain.
12. I (put) put the \$5 note into one of my books, but next day it (take) took me ages to find it because I (forget) had forgotten which book I (put) had put it into.
13. - Where (you go) are you going (to go) this evening?  
- I (not go) am not going (to go) anywhere. I (stay) am staying/am going to stay home. I (write) am going to write some mails.
14. - You (come back) Are you coming/going to come back to England after that or you (go) are you going home?  
- It (depend) depends on my father. But if he (agree) agrees to let me go on studying here I'll certainly come back. And I (expect) expect he will agree.
15. When Ann (be) was on her way to the station it (begin) began to rain. Ann (run) ran back to her flat for her umbrella, but this (make) made her late for her train.
16. - I'll be back again at the end of the month.  
- I hope I (pass) will have passed my driving test by then!
17. I (not wear) won't be wearing glasses when you see me next. I'll be wearing contact lenses. You (probably not recognize) won't probably recognize me.
18. - I heard that Mr Jones (leave) has left.  
- Yes, he (leave) left last week.  
- (Anybody be) Has anybody been appointed to take his place?  
- I believe several men (apply) have applied for the job but so far nothing (be) has been decided.
19. I (look) was looking through the classroom window. A geometry lesson (go) was going on. The teacher (draw) was drawing diagrams on the blackboard.

20. I (see) seeing/am going to see my bank manager tomorrow (arranged). I'm going to ask him for a loan but I think he (refuse) will refuse.
21. (you please send) Will/Could you please send my mail to the Grand Hotel? I (stay) will be staying there as usual for the first fortnight of August.
22. In the evenings I (often play) often play chess with my next door neighbour. I (play) have been playing/have played chess with him ever since I (come) came to live here ten years ago. He (be) has been here all his life; he (inherit) inherited the house from his father, another great chess player.
23. - Someone (use) has used my umbrella! It's all wet!  
- Well, it wasn't me. I (not be) haven't been out of the house for a week!

27. - Don't ring now; I'm sure she (watch) is watching her favourite series.  
- All right. I (ring) will ring at 8:30 then.
