- 1. (you get up) <u>Are you going to get up</u> today, or (you stay) <u>are you staying</u> in bed? If you (get up) <u>get up</u>, don't go outside. It (be) <u>is</u> very cold.
- 2. After a long forced march, Caesar (enter) <u>entered</u> the town only to find that the enemy (flee) <u>had</u> <u>fled</u>: he (make) <u>had made</u> the long march in vain.
- 3. Don't talk to me. I (try) am trying to learn this page by heart.
- 4. She's alive! She (drown) was drowning but that handsome man (dive) $\frac{dived/dove}{dove}$ and (save) saved her just in time.
- 5. I (know) <u>have known</u> Miss Huggins for several years. I (read) <u>am reading</u> her latest novel, but I (not finish) <u>haven't finished</u> it yet.
- 6. By the end of my tour I (give) will have given exactly the same lecture 56 times.
- 7. Why (that man stand) is that man standing in the middle of the road?
 - He (try) is trying to get across. He (wait) is waiting for a gap in the traffic.
 - Why (he not use) isn't he using/doesn't he use the subway?
- 8. I (just have) have just had my first driving lesson.
 - How (it go) did it go (you enjoy) Did you enjoy it?
 - Well, I (actually not hit) didn't actually hit anything but I (make) made many mistakes.
- 9. She (just sell) has just sold two of her own paintings.
 - She's lucky. I (paint) <u>have painted/have been painting</u> for 5 years and I (not sell) <u>haven't sold</u> a single picture yet.
- 10. He (sit) <u>was sitting</u> on the bank fishing when he (see) <u>saw</u> a man's hat floating down the river. It (seem) <u>seemed</u> strangely familiar.
- 11. Where (you go) are you going (to go) for your next holiday? (arranged to go)
 - I don't know yet but we (probably go) will probably go to Spain.
- 12. I (put) <u>put</u> the \$5 note into one of my books, but next day it (take) <u>took</u> me ages to find it because I (forget) <u>had forgotten</u> which book I (put) <u>had put</u> it into.
- 13. Where (you go) are you going (to go) this evening?

- I (not go) <u>am not going (to go)</u> anywhere. I (stay) <u>am staying/am going to stay</u> home. I (write) <u>am going to write</u> some mails.

14. - You (come back) <u>Are you coming/going to come back</u> to England after that or you (go) <u>are you</u> <u>going</u> home?

- 20.I (see) <u>seeing/am going to see</u> my bank manager tomorrow *(arranged*). I'm going to ask him for a loan but I think he (refuse) <u>will refuse</u>.
- 21. (you please send) <u>Will/Could you please send</u> my mail to the Grand Hotel? I (stay) <u>will be staying</u> there as usual for the first fortnight of August.
- 22. In the evenings I (often play) <u>often play</u> chess with my next door neighbour. I (play) <u>have been playing/have played</u> chess with him ever since I (come) <u>came</u> to live here ten years ago.
