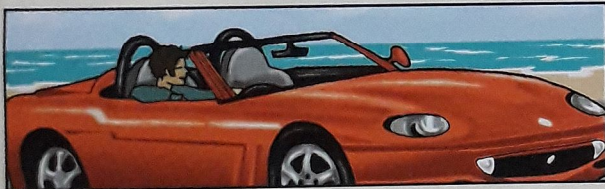
Watch out!

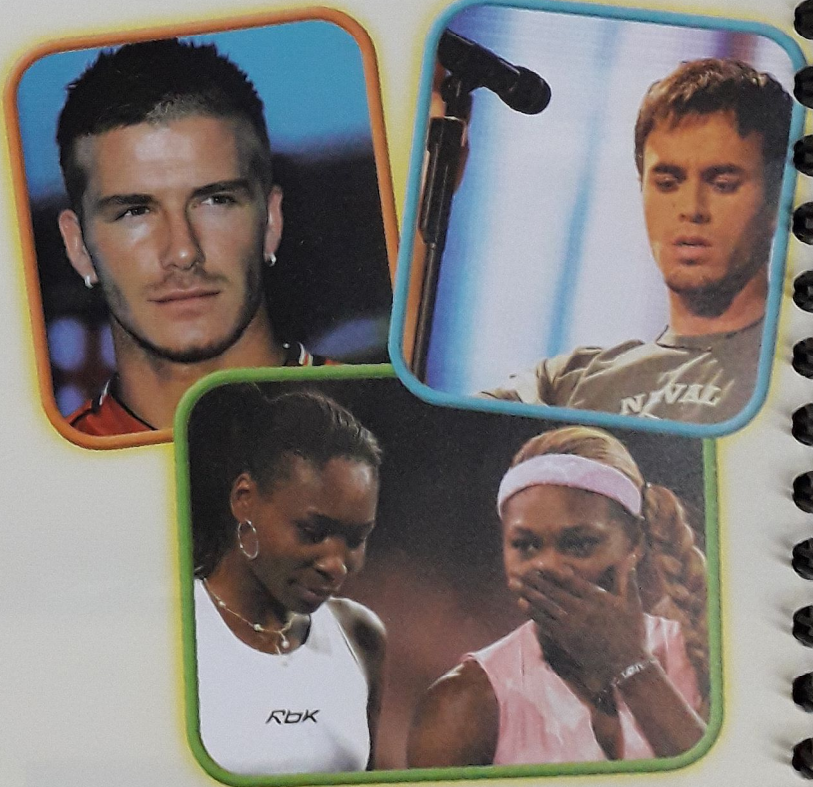
