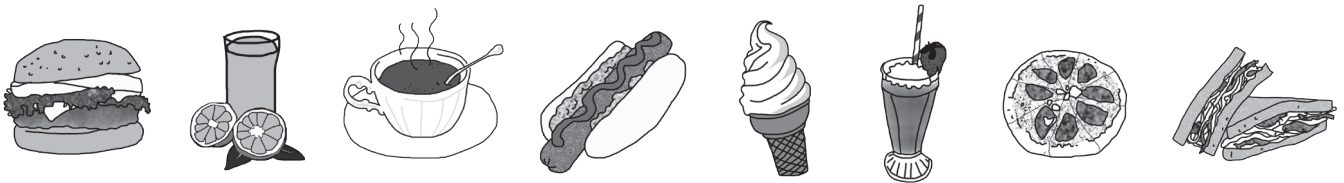

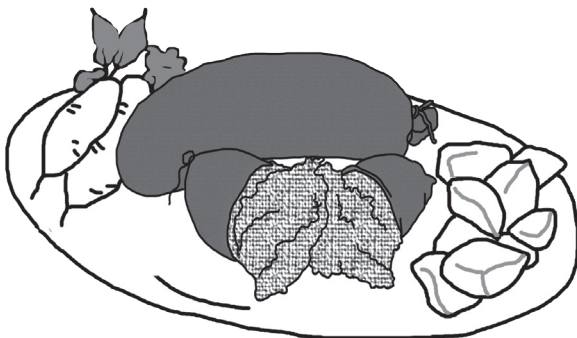

### Haggis

**Do you know what a haggis is?** Many people in Scotland love eating it, but not many people outside of Scotland know what it is.

Haggis is the national food of Scotland. Scottish people usually make this traditional food from sheep, but can also use cow or pig. It is the insides of the animal - the heart and other parts. To make it, you take these parts out of the animal and cut them into very small pieces. Then cut up some onions and add some salt and pepper. There are other things also, but this is a secret! Then put it all back into the stomach of the sheep. Cook it in water slowly for about three hours.



Traditionally people eat it with 'tatties and neeps', that's potatoes and turnips - types of vegetable. But now you can buy haggis and chips as takeaway food.

There is also a sport called 'haggis-hurling'. The aim is to throw a haggis as far as possible. The record is over 66 metres. Perhaps it is a sport for people who really don't like haggis!
