Everyone knows that smoking is bad for your health. However, many people continue to smoke because it's very difficult to quit. Now, in the Philippines, there may soon be a new law that will help smokers to quit. When police find people who smoke in public in the Philippines, they may have to pay a **fine** of 5,000 Philippine pesos (US\$103). If they don't want to pay the money, or if they don't have the money, they will go to jail for four months. One government official said that, in addition to buildings, public places include 'parks, bus stations, and even in [public] vehicles.' This news is bad news for big international companies that sell so many cigarettes in Southeast Asia. For many people in the Philippines, however, this is a great idea because smoking is so common there. In fact, nearly half of all men smoke in the Philippines.
