Subject + wish	+ Subject	+ past perfect > regrets about the past regret (n): pesar, arrepentimiento; to regret (v): lamentar
If only more emphatic,		+ past > regrets about the present
stronger		+ would > complaints: quejas

I wish/ If only I hadn't gone out in the rain without an umbrella.
