## MODAL PERFECT VERBS

MODAL + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE of main verb (must have invited, should have had)

The negative form is MODAL + NOT + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE (couldn't have done)

## 1. MUST HAVE expresses a logical deduction

- ∠ May bag has gone, someone must have stolen it while I was distracted.
- ✓ I must have deleted the email, I can't find it.
- 2. COULD HAVE expresses a possibility
- ✓ You could have asked the doctor before taking the medicine.
- ✓ The wallet could had fallen out of my pocket
- 3. COULDN'T HAVE expresses an impossibility
- A He couldn't have stolen the laptop he was with me all the time.
- ✓ But Peter couldn't have cared less.
- 4. MAY / MIGHT HAVE expresses a supposition
- ✓ She may have taken the wrong bus.
- She might have given my handbag to another person.
- 5. WOULD HAVE expresses a wish
- ✓ I would have gone to your party but I had to work.
- ✓ If he found out that you have cheated him, he would have gotten furious
- 6. SHOULD / OUGHT TO expresses a regret or criticism
- Solution You should have thanked his help. He was very kind and friendly with you.
- ✓ I ought to have known that it was a big mistake.
- 7. SHOULDN'T HAVE expresses a regret or criticism
- ✓ The grasshopper knew that he shouldn't have been lazy during the summer.
- ✓ You shouldn't have forgotten her birthday.

## 8. NEEDN'T HAVE expresses an unnecessary action

- ✓ You needn't have brought anything to my party.
- Solution You needn't have bought anything to the baby, he has a lot of things, but thanks anyway.

CERTAINTY or LOGICAL DEDUCTION	MUST HAVE +pp	Certainty that something was true in the past. Something probably happened in the past.	You must have known I was angry, it was so obvious!
	CAN'T HAVE +pp	Certainty that something wasn't true in the past	I can't have made a good impression because he hasn't phoned me yet.
POSSIBILITY	COULD HAVE + pp	Past possibility	You could have told me your mum was in hospital.
	MAY HAVE + pp		She may have phoned, but we don't know because we were in the garden.
	MIGHT HAVE + pp		You might have known the answer.
ABILITY	COULD HAVE + pp	Ability to have done something but in fact you didn't do it.	You could have played better
ADVICE or	SHOULD HAVE + pp	Criticism or regret about something	I was anxious, you should have phoned me.
RECOMMENDATION	OUGHT TO HAVE + pp	you did wrong. You didn't do something which was a good idea.	I ought to have apologized, I had been very rude.
LACK OF NECESSITY	NEEDN'T HAVE + pp	We did something although it	You needn't have made so many pancakes, nobody is
		wasn't necessary to be done. Unnecessary past action.	hungry now.
